

Ngā Pūrongo Uara Māori

- E koa ana a The Independent Māori Statutory Board (te Poari) ki te tāpae atu i ngā pūrongo mō te Uara Māori.
- E mātāi ana ngā pūrongo Uara Māori i whanaketanga o te hauora Māori mā te whai i tētahi tikanga e ū ana ki ngā uara Māori (Te Ao Māori) kia mātaitia ai te hauora i tā te iwi taketake titiro.
- Ko te aronga, he whakawhānui i te māramatanga o te Kaunihera o Tāmaki-makaurau me te kāwanatanga hoki ki te whakamahi i tētahi tikanga e ū ana ki ngā uara Māori i ngā whakataunga ka whaipanga ki te hauora Māori.
- E hāngai ana ia pūrongo e rima ki tētahi uara Māori (arā ki te Rangatiratanga, ki te Manaakitanga, ki te Kaitiakitanga, ki te Whanaungatanga, me te Wairuatanga). E mātaitia an ate hauora Māori i runga i ngā ariā Māori, i runga hoki i tā te Māori titiro ki te ao mā te mātāi ki te painga o ngā wawata, o ngā mahi me ngā whakatutukinga Māori.
- Hei pou here ngā uara Māori e rima e hāpai ana i ngā pūrongo Uara Māori mō te tuhinga matua a te Poari, arā mō te *Schedule*

of Issues of Significance and Māori Plan (2017). E aro ana tēnei mahere ki ngā putanga e 20 kua tautuhia e te Māori i Tāmaki Makaurau hei pūtake mō te hauora. E whakamārama ana tēnei puka i te āhua o te mahi tahi a ngā pūrongo Uara Māori me tēnei tuhinga.

- He mea nui kia mārama ki te hauora Māori hei arataki i te ahunga o ngā kaupapa here, hei aroturuki hoki i te pānga o ngā whakataunga kaupapa here ki te Māori i Tāmaki Makaurau.
- He whāia ana tētahi tikanga hou i roto i ngā Pūrongo Uara Māori hei whakatairanga i ngā uara Māori me ngā ariā hei ārahi i te whanaketanga o te mātāi i te hauora Māori, arā e hāngai ana te mātaitanga ki te Māori, e ū ana hoki ki tā te Māori titiro ki te ao.
- Ko te whāinga, ka takoto i ngā pūrongo tētahi rauemi whaihua mā ngā kaiwhakatakoto kaupapa here me ngā kaiwhakamahere i te kaunihera ā-rohe me te kāwanatanga, tae hoki ki ngā NGO, ngā pakihī, ngā whare mātauranga, ngā hāpori Māori, ngā iwi me ngā hapū.

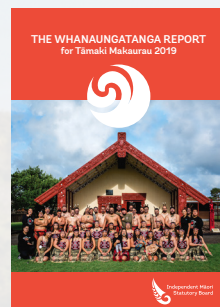

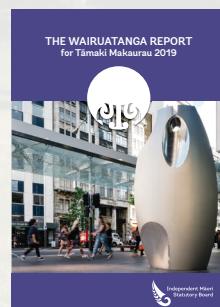

Ko te take o te Mahere Māori me ngā pūrongo Uara Māori he mātai i te hauora Māori i runga i tā te Māori titiro ki te ao kia pai ai te aroturuki i ngā whanaketanga o te hauora Māori i roto i te wā i Tāmaki Makaurau.






I ahu mai ngā uara Māori e rima i ngā pūrongo Uara i te Mahere Māori. I te Mahere Māori, e hono ana ngā uara ki ngā ahunga matua e whakaatu mai ana i ngā wawata whānui o te Māori mō ō rātou ake iwi, whakahaere, hāpori anō hoki.

E hāngai ana ngā wāhanga, ngā wāhi hauora rānei ki ngā pou e whā, arā ki te taha whānau, te taha ahurea, te taha ōhanga, me te taha hauora. I ahu mai ēnei i te takenga o te Poari, arā he āwhina i te Kaunihera o Tāmaki Makaurau i ngā whakataunga mō ngā take ā-pāpori, ā-ahurea, ā-ōhanga, ā-taiao hoki.
